## Main Venue (Hall E, B2 floor)

There will be booths in the four categories of "*i* (clothing)," "*shoku* (food)," "*ju* (building)," and "*kou* (manufacturing)," where visitors will be able to not only see and buy traditional crafts but also observe craftsmen at work and try their hand at various activities.

Many entities from various parts of the country will participate, including those setting up booths for supporting post-disaster reconstruction of Fukushima and Kumamoto prefectures.
