

1 Kokugikan

Kokuqikan is a stadium for sumo Japan's national sport. In Kokugikan, the Grand Sumo Tournament is held three times a year, drawing a lot of sumo fans in January, May, and September. Its Sumo Museum, which collects and preserves items related to sumo, is also popular.



Points In and Around Fukagawa

Kiyosumi Gardens

Kiyosumi Gardens was established in the late 19th century by Yataro lwasaki, the founder of the Mitsubishi conglomerate. It is a *kaiyu-shiki tsukiyama sansui teien* (traditional Japanese-style stroll garden with hills and ponds), and known for its landscape rocks including beautiful and oddly shaped ones.

1 Tomioka Hachimangu Shrine

Also known as Fukagawa Hachiman, the shrine is famous for its Fukagawa Hachiman Festival, one of Tokyo's three major festivals that date back to the Edo period. On the grounds of the shrine, there are monuments related to the area, including one that honors vokagaria sumo grand champions to fairs are held on the 1st, 15th ar 28th of every month.

The bridge, which was said to be the symbol of old Edo's prosperity, was the starting point for the five major highways of the Edo period. The Road Origin Marker of Japan (Kilometer 0) is embedded in the center of the bridge. In the nearby surrounding area, you will find long-established department stores and other businesses.

The world's only theatre used exclusively for Kabuki opened more than 120 years ago. Kabuki plays, which started at the theatre in the Meiji period, do not stop with the classics, but also incorporate the feel of the era in which they are performed. Completed in 2013, the new Kabukiza is the theatre's fifth incarnation.
